COLLECTIBLE ITEMS



Household garbage



Broken down cardboard boxes

RESIDENTIAL MEDICAL WASTE DISPOSAL



Must be disposed of in a manner that helps minimize health risks to waste management and landfill workers. Sharp medical objects must be placed in a medical/health care container with a tight-fitting lid and "Non-recyclable" written on it. Do not use glass containers.

UNCOLLECTIBLE ITEMS



Landscape materials



Construction materials



Anything in a non Town-issued cart



PROPER DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

DO NOT FLUSH prescription drugs down the toilet. Instead, take them to a drug take-back location.



COMPACT FLOURESCENT LIGHTBULB DISPOSAL

Take all unbroken bulbs to a big box home improvement store where they will be properly recycled.

COLLECTIBLE ITEMS

Yard Debris - leaves/grass clippings in brown paper bags, brush, tree limbs



Appliances and metal items



Furniture, and other non-food items that you are unable to donate or recycle



E-waste - These items must be placed separately at the curb for special collection/ recycling. Residents can also take their e-waste to County drop-off sites for proper disposal.

UNCOLLECTIBLE ITEMS



Engine Parts



Hazardous materials



Tires



Batteries



Wet Paint



Tree Stumps



Contractor generated debris from construction, demolition, remodeling, or landscaping



Oil (used oil can be recycled of at our Six Mile Facility)
