Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C.

June 13th 1900.

A special meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8:30

Present - P. V. Royall, Intendant, and Wardens Coleman, Hamlin, Mitchell, Smith, Pinckney and Weinheimer.

The Intendant stated that this meeting had been called for the purpose of discussing with Mr. Hill, General Manager of the Charleston Consolidated Railway Co., the differences between the Trolley Co. and the town with reference to the stations along their line.

Mr. Hill was invited to state the case for the Company.

On Warden Smith's motion it was agreed that if the stations are changed, Nos. 1 and 2 should be combined and placed in front of the Academy.

On motion of Warden Smith it was agreed that on receipt of a letter from Mr. Hill, General Manager of the Seashore Railroad, requesting certain changes in the stations, the present Ordinances relating to stopping places called stations be amended to conform thereto.

Warden Smith gave notice that at the next meeting of Council he would introduce a Bill amending the Ordinances in relation to the regulation of the running of trains by the Consolidated Railroad.
