

Regular

Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., June 18, 1900.

A Regular Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8:30. — Present — R. O. Royal, Intendant, and Wardens Coleman, Hamlin, Mitchell, Smith, Pincken, and Wrinkeiner.

The minutes of the last Regular and two Special Meetings were read and confirmed.

Letter

A letter from Mr. Hill in regard to the placing of Stations on the Trolley Line was read.

Petition

A petition was received from Mr. Fitch and other citizens requesting ^{that certain} Ordinances relating to the Trolley Company be enforced and other regulations in the same line be made.

Also a petition was received from Geo. P. von Kolwitz, Esq. requesting that no final action be taken in regard to the proposed amendments to the Railroad Ordinances, until a mass meeting could be held and the sentiment of the people be ascertained.

Reports

The Intendants Court reported the collection of half a fine from Robt Francis, amounting to 5.⁰⁰; and the Marshal reported the collection of \$4.⁵⁰ from various sources.

Drainage

On Warden Pincken's motion the Drainage Committee was instructed to continue the Hilliardsville Drain into the low depression from Centre Street 400 ft. towards McCormick Street, and to accept Mr. McGarvey's bid at 25 cents per foot, he to put in all necessary wells and the town to furnish the material.

Warden Hamlin asked the Continuance of his Ordinance on Draining private lots. On Warden Pincken's motion it was granted.

1st Reading

Warden Smith's bill to amend the Ordinances relating to Trolley Stations, ^{and otherwise regulating Railway and Trolley Lines} received its First Reading.

Continued

On Warden Smith's motion consent was given to continue the Bill to prevent obstructions being placed on the Ferry Landing.

Third Reading

The License Bill received its Third Reading. On Warden Smith's motion it was passed as a whole, its title changed to that of an Ordinance, and ordered engrossed, signed, and sealed.

The Bill to Raise Supplies also received its Third Reading. On Warden Smith's motion it passed as a whole, its title changed to that of an Ordinance, and ordered engrossed, signed, and sealed.

On Warden Mitchell's motion Walker, Evans, & Cogswell Co's bill of \$195 was ordered paid.
