

Regular.

Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., July 16, 1900.

A Regular Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8:30 o'clock.

Present - A. V. Royall, Intendant, and Wardens Hamlin, Mitchell, Smith and Fincken.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and Confirmed.

Complaint

Two communications were received from Mr. A. F. C. Cramer complaining of the drain running through his lot near the U.S. Light House building, and requesting its removal. On motion of Warden Fincken the Intendant was instructed to reply to his complaints.

Warden Hamlin moved that a paper be drawn up by the Solicitor and signed by all persons through whose property any drains run, with witness to the signatures, giving permission for such drains.

Petition.

A petition of Prince Simmons for reduction of license on instalment furniture store was referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

Bills Paid.

Bills of Evening Post for \$1.00; Walker, Evans, & Ogden Co., for \$4.50, were ordered paid.

Report.

The Marshal reported \$125 collected by him.

The Ways and Means Committee reported that the license for a Veterinary Surgeon be fixed at \$2.00.

3rd Reading.

Warden Smith's Bill to amend the Railroad Ordinance received Third Reading. On motion of Warden Mitchell it was passed as a whole, and ordered properly engrossed, signed, and sealed.

The Bill to require Motormen and Conductors to stop at all stations received Third Reading. On motion of Warden Smith it was passed as a whole, and ordered properly engrossed, signed, and sealed.

1st & 2nd Reading.

Warden Hamlin's Bill to require lot owners to clean them of bushes, etc. received its First & Second Reading.

The Drainage Committee was authorized, on motion of Warden Hamlin, to extend on either ^{side} laterals to the Hilliardsville Drain, sufficiently far to allow owners of private lots to drain into it.

Warden Fincken's Bill to regulate the sweeping of chimneys was received, but, in his absence, its first reading was deferred to the next meeting of Council. Adjourned
