

Regular.

Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., Nov. 5, 1900.

A Regular Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 7:30  
Present: - P. V. Royall, Intendant, and Warden Coleman, Hamlin,  
Jorgensen, Mitchell, Smith and Pincken.

The Minutes of the last Regular and of the Special Meeting  
were read and confirmed.

Report.

The Intendants' Court reported the collection of one fine of \$5.00.

Requests.

A request from C. W. Lucker for the elevation of the sidewalk at  
his residence was on motion of Warden Pincken referred to the  
Street Committee.

A request from Miss Mears for the improvement of the  
sidewalk around the Colored School was also received; and on mo-  
tion of Warden Pincken the Clerk was instructed to reply  
that the matter has been referred to the Street Committee for ac-  
tion when the fence lines conform to the street lines.

Bid Received

A bid was received from Boston Parkes for the place of  
Lamplighter at \$15.00 per month which was referred to the  
Committee on Streets. The Street Committee requested the vote  
of Council on the matter. Warden Mitchell moved that the  
bid of Parker at \$15.00 by the month be accepted. It was carried.

Warden Pincken moved that on receipt of the resignation of the  
Street Overseer, who has removed from town, the Clerk adver-  
tise 10 days for applications for the office. It was carried.

Bills Payable.

Bills of W. D. Hamlin for \$58.40 and \$13.75, and of Rott Mag-  
wood for \$24.73 were ordered paid.

3rd Reading.

Warden Smith's Bill to Amend an Ordinance entitled An Ordina-  
ance to impose and regulate the granting of Licenses for the fiscal year  
beginning July 1st 1900 and ending June 30th 1901 received its Third  
Reading. On motion of Warden Mitchell it was passed as a whole, its  
title changed to that of an Ordinance, and ordered properly engrossed,  
signed, and sealed.

Comm Report

The Committee on Accounts reported that they had examined  
all books, vouchers, &c of the Town Treasurer and found them  
correct; and that there was a balance of \$3028.<sup>86</sup> on hand.

People's Line  
of Steamboats.

Mr. Fitch of the People's Line of Steamboats appeared for the enter-  
prise, and requested that the matter of a 5 cent fare be stricken  
from the beginning of the Report of the Committee on People's Line, and  
be put at the end as a matter to be arranged by Council and  
the Managers. On motion of Warden Mitchell it was so ordered.

Warden Pincken asked continuance of his Notice of the intro-  
duction of Ordinances on the People's Line. It was granted.

On Warden Jorgensen's motion the salary of Intendant was fixed at \$250.00  
per annum. - Adjourned.
