Town Hall, Mt. Pleasant, S.C., Aug. 19, 1901.  
 A Regular Meeting of Town Council was held this evening at 8 o'clock.

Present: R. V. Royall, Intendant, and Wardens Hamlin, Jorgensen, Mitchell, Smith, and Pincken.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

Report.

The Marshal reported the collection of \$12.<sup>20</sup> in various licenses & sale of oil barrels; and the payment of bill of S. Pincken amounting to 40 cents; balance of \$11.<sup>80</sup> turned over to the Treasurer.

Bills Payable.

Bills of Electric Supply Co. of \$4.<sup>00</sup>; E. Pincken \$65.<sup>10</sup>; W. D. Hamlin \$25.<sup>75</sup>; W. D. Hamlin \$59.<sup>25</sup>; W. E. Holmes \$4.<sup>76</sup> were ordered paid.

Warden Smith on behalf of the Street Committee stated that the contract for shelling Pitt St. from Centre to Ferry Streets had been given to Prince Goodwin at 10 cents per load.

Sale of Lots.

On motion of Warden Smith the sale of the four L lots surrounding the ~~block~~ on the Commons was temporarily withdrawn.

Petition.

A petition was received from certain citizens asking for a sidewalk on Bank St., a lamp at Boundary and Bank, which was, on motion of Warden Smith, referred to the Street Committee with power to act.

The Committee on the purchase of part of the Dow lot for Street purposes reported that it was impossible to make any arrangements with Mrs. Dow at this time.

On motion of Warden Pincken the Clerk was instructed to make three (3) copies of such sections of the Railroad Ordinances as were being violated by the Charleston Consolidated R.R. & E.C., and to post them for the information of the public.
