Meeting of Council was held this evening.

Treasurer reported cash on hand June 30 - \$162.82. Collections during July - \$6123.70. Paid out during July \$481.29 Balance cash on hand and in Bank July 31 - 1929. \$5805.25.

Committee on investigation of Edward Jenkins, reported that Jenkins is receiving \$72. month pension from the U.S. Gov.

The question of continuing or discontinuing, the Pension by the Town was put to a vote, Yeas. W.L. Eckman, Nays. J.C. Coleman, C.C. Heron, J.C. Freeman. The pension was ordered discontinued.

Committee on Tank reported, that they had secured the services of Mr. Carter to examine the Tank, and Mr. Carter that he found the tank in very good condition.

The Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Gulds, asking what would be the lowest price he would accept for the outfit. That the Council considered the first offer excessive.

Moved and Second that the Town offer a reward of \$25.00 for evidence to convict party or parties guilty of destroying painting on side walk, at Post Office.

Council ordered that Committee be allowed \$10.00 for decorations for Town
